Florence Ann Reinhart was born on May 26, 1920, to Joseph and Bridget (nee Dosman) Reinhart on the family farm, near Waldsea Lake, Sask. She was the youngest in the family of four girls and two boys. Florence attended St. Bernard's School for grades one to ten, and she completed grades eleven and twelve at Humboldt Collegiate. After one year at Normal School in Saskatoon and three university classes, Florence received her First Class permanent teaching certificate, later teaching in schools in Sinnett, Carmel, Annaheim and Fulda, Sask. In 1947, she moved to Humboldt and worked at John Kolbas' shoe store, followed by Fletcher's Drug Store, which was later named Marshall Drugs, where Florence worked for 29 years. Florence enjoyed the opportunity to travel to British Columbia, Prince Edward Island, Alaska and Hawaii. One of her road trips was to the Eucharistic Congress in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania in 1976. She later fondly recalled that event as the place she heard Mother Teresa of Calcutta, Archbishop Fulton Sheen, Dorothy Day and Father Patrick Peyton speak. In 1980, Florence retired and focused on her volunteer work and she was a member of "Friends of the Museum" in Humboldt. Knitting, crocheting, designing greeting cards with fabric or pressed flowers, and playing card games with friends were all pastimes that Florence appreciated. In 1987, Florence became a Lay Oblate of St. Benedict in Muenster, Sask. and she was very proud of this decision. In 2016, she moved to Maria's Care Home in Humboldt, where she was grateful for the excellent care and attention she received.

Florence was predeceased by her parents, Joseph and Bridget (nee Dosman) Reinhart; her three sisters: Hildegard (Henry) Reineke, Cleopha (August) Hoene, and Alberta Reinhart and her two brothers: John (Anne) Reinhart and William (Madeline) Reinhart.
