They moved to Irene's parents homestead in the Pilger area where they raised their 11 children and operated a mixed farm with grain and livestock. Fred also drove school bus for 13 years in Pilger. In 1978 they moved to Humboldt to make their home, with Fred continuing to drive bus for 1 year. Fred also did carpentry work and painting for Hoffman Lumber. Fred and Irene celebrated their "70th" Wedding Anniversary on July 8, 2017.
